## **Objective: Support Good Data Management Practises**



### Requirements

- Show compliance with standards and best practises
- Monitor and assess the quality of data processes and services
- □ Sharing data => store them in a **trustworthy** data repository
- Data must be **managed**, curated, and archived
- Remain useful and meaningful into the future
   Continued access to data

To demonstrate the institute's **capabilities** to provide data and services in **compliance** with established **standards** and responsibilities, there has been a focus over the past five years on relevant supporting **accreditations/certifications**

Ensuring high quality, transparent data processes & be a trustworthy data repository



## Data Management - Quality Management Framework


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- 2019: The Marine Institute's NODC received International accreditation of its Data Management Quality Management Framework (QMF) by the IOC-IODE programme (Leadbetter et al., 2020)
- Identified and fully documented all the data handling
  Processes & Procedures in the Marine Institute
- The QMF guides data management activities from collection, storage, quality control, and analysis to data outputs from minting DOIs to legislative reporting

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## Data Management - Quality Management Framework Current status:





**126** datasets/processes are managed through the DM-QMF



Regularly reviewed and improved



Extending the QMF to research project data



In March 2023, the Marine Institute has been successful in achieving re-accreditation.

#### Outcome

Provide access and usability of the data as well as the reliability of the underlying services.

The quality assurance of these data processes provides a solid foundation for the evidence-based national marine decision making.

# **Next Steps:**

Support to National Marine Programmes e.g. National Marine Planning Framework, the Ocean Renewable Energy Development Plan and for marine licensing services

- Further extending remit in managing **third party data**, research data (potentially mandated)
- Discrete data from an external organisation => need appropriate documentation to ensure data are available for reuse
- Build stakeholder confidence

Action: Explored complimentary accreditations to:

- Further support data management activities data preservation
- Review and **improve** the quality and transparency of our processes
- Recognised trustworthy data repository



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 To demonstrate our commitment to effectively managing and preserving data over time, ensuring its integrity and accessibility for both current and future use

## **CoreTrustSeal Certification**



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- "CoreTrustSeal is an international, comm non-governmental, and non-profit organ promoting sustainable and trustworthy c infrastructures"
- Long-term preservation
- An enabler of FAIR data
- Complimentary to the existing DM-QMF and preserve data over time
- Valid for 3 years
- MI is working towards obtaining this cert
- Evaluates repositories against a number requirements
- Two step certification process
